Carol Hemersbach leads the lefse making and is looking for not only lefse rollers, but fryers, cutters & packagers, so not all jobs require standing.

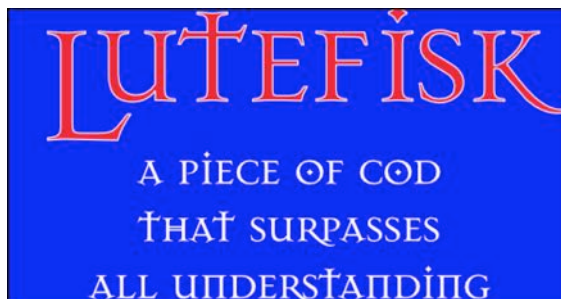

I Want A Dream Coat!

My Big Guy did something SO much better than reading me a story from the Bible. We watched a movie! Did you know they made movies about the stories in the Bible? And they SANG in this one.

The movie is called Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat. It tells the story from Genesis about Joseph and his mean brothers, and what happened to Joseph.

Joseph was one of 12 sons of Jacob, who was also called Israel, and was his father's favorite. Jacob gave Joseph this coat of many colors, which I didn't see as such a big deal. But Jacob could see what was going to happen and could figure out what dreams mean.

I think that would be awesome. If I knew what was going to happen, I could warn people. If I could tell what dreams meant, I could help people to know what to do.

While Joseph's brothers were mean to him – they sold him to slavery and pretended he was dead – Joseph didn't take the opportunity to pay them back. Instead, he used his position to help them out.

My Big Guy said many of the stories in Genesis are about people who weren't the best, but God was able to do great things through them. Joseph's dad, Jacob, was a real scoundrel. Jacob's dad, Isaac, was almost sacrificed by his father, Abraham, and Abraham would tell people that his wife, Sarah, was his sister! I thought my brothers and sisters were strange!!

But in the story about Joseph, God was always with Joseph in all of the bad things that happened to him, and there were a lot of them. Joseph trusted in God, and God provided for him.

I think God can use us to help accomplish the things God wants, but we have to be willing to trust God, and be willing to sometimes do things that we may not be comfortable doing.

It is hard to speak about our faith. It can be hard to give of the things you have. It can be hard to dedicate some of your time. It can be hard to help others. But those are all things God wants us to do. Those are things Jesus said we should do. We can do them, but they may be easier if we put our trust in God.

Those whom God blessed, especially those through Abraham's family were not the best people. They had faults, just like all of us. But through them God blessed the people of Israel. And they were supposed to bless all of us.

So maybe we can be a blessing to others, even if we are not perfect. I really like that idea. I'm going to try to be a blessing to My Big Guy and to others.

The one thing I don't know about the movie we watched. How did Joseph and all of the children of Israel get out of Egypt? Do you know if there is another movie?.

Live Out the Small Catechism

The **Ten Commandments** tell us what to do, or more often, what not to do. Luther's commentary opens up these narrow strictures and leads us toward ideas for positive action.

1. **You shall have no other gods.**

Explore other faiths, such as Judaism, Islam, Hinduism. Doing so need not threaten our Christian beliefs, but will help strengthen understanding of their perspectives on God, create partnerships, and reduce harmful stereotypes.

2. **You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the Lord your God.**

Get creative about prayer! One ELCA pastor has sat in a coffee shop with a Free Prayer sign. Let people know you are willing to pray for their concerns. Start a prayer ministry in your congregation.

3. **Remember the Sabbath day, and keep it holy.**

In many places, a struggle for parents of children and youth is athletics that schedule games and matches on Sunday mornings. If this is the case, consider joining with others to lobby for fewer games on Sunday mornings.

4. **Honor your father and your mother.**

Many church buildings are underused on weekdays. How can your building can be a gift to parents? Perhaps you could have a staffed nursery near a Wi-Fi-equipped room where parents can work, or an arrangement for child-care while single parents get away for shopping, appointments, or recreation.

5. **You shall not murder.**

Who are the most vulnerable in your city or town, and how can you support them? Some ideas would include donating to or volunteering at a shelter for battered women, participating in a program that provides meals for seniors, tutoring recent immigrants.

6. **You shall not commit adultery.**

Our society's unrealistic views on marriage often mean that once the wedding is over, young couples struggle to establish sustainable relationships. Can your congregation help with support groups, mentors, or people to call when problems arise?

7. **You shall not steal.**

The poorest among us are often most vulnerable to predatory lending practices such as payday loans. Using the enticements of readily available cash, victims are immersed ever more deeply in debt.

8. **You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.**

The saying goes "If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is." Often the reverse is also true: people and groups get an undeserved bad rap. This can be countered on an individual basis by speaking up when you hear slander, or through a congregation coming to the aid of a population denigrated because of race, ethnic or religious identity, or economic class.

9. **You shall not covet your neighbor’s house.**
When it comes to property care, homeowners or renters can get overwhelmed when visited by illness, injury, or the frailty of old age. How can you be of assistance? Cleaning, painting, lawn care, and simple maintenance are examples of helpful activities that can be taken on.
10. **You shall not covet your neighbor’s wife, or male or female slave, or ox, or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.**
The book of Acts tells us the early church held everything in common. That may not be practical these days, but what about a decentralized “lending library” of tools? Whether it’s cooking, home maintenance, lawn and garden—each area has specialized tools that aren’t needed very often.

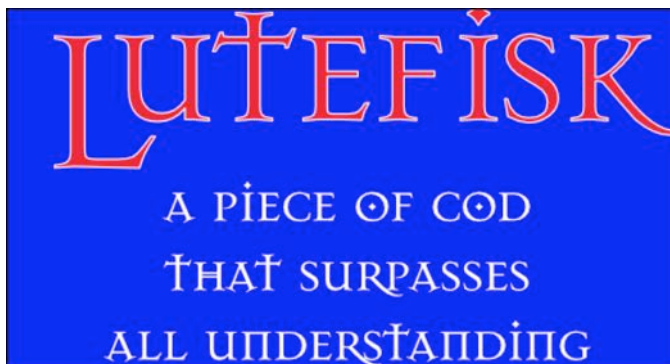
Reformation 500 Worship Plans

The average budget expense is calculated by dividing the expenses from budget as approved at a church’s Annual Meeting, divided by the number of Sundays in the year. The difference is the amount, plus or minus, between that week’s offering and the average weekly budget expenses.
